



The GED is a high school equivalency test that provides individuals who didn't finish high school with a credential recognized by colleges, employers, and the military

Eligibility Requirements:

- Test takers must be at least 18 years old (or 17 with additional state requirements).
- No high school diploma or enrollment in high school.
- Available at test centers or online (if eligible)

Recognition

- Passing the GED earns you a High School Equivalency Diploma, accepted by colleges, employers, and the military in the U.S.
- More widely recognized than the HiSET, as some states only offer the GED.

Cost:

- The cost varies by state, typically ranging from \$120-\$160 for all four tests.
- Some states offer free or discounted testing programs.

The HiSET (High School Equivalency Test) in California is an alternative to a traditional high school diploma. It allows individuals who didn't graduate from high school to earn an equivalency credential recognized by colleges and employers.

Eligibility Requirements:

- Test takers must be at least 18 years old (or 17 with additional requirements).
- California residents can take the test at authorized testing centers or via an online proctored option (if eligible).

Recognition

 Passing the HiSET gives you a California High School Equivalency Certificate, which is accepted by colleges, employers, and the military

Cost:

- The price varies, but California typically offers lower fees compared to the GED.
- Some programs may offer free or reduced-cost testing for qualifying individuals.

HISET Proficiency Exam

The HiSET Proficiency Exam awards students with a California Certificate of Proficiency, legally equivalent to a state-issued high school diploma.

Eligibility Requirements:

- 16 years of age or older or
- Enrolled in grade 10 for one school year or longer or
- Will complete one school year of enrollment in grade 10 at the end of the semester when the exam is taken

The student must be currently subject to California's compulsory education laws.

Recognition

- Passing the HiSET gives you a California Certificate of Proficiency, which holds the same legal equivalent as a California-issued high school diploma.
- The California Certificate of Proficiency is widely accepted at all California colleges and employers.
- Upon receiving Official Score Report and exiting high school, individuals become eligible to take the remaining two subtests of the HiSET (Science and Social Studies) to obtain a California High School Equivalency Certificate, which is recognized nationally and internationally. This certificate can open more opportunities than a California Certificate of Proficiency alone.

Cost:

- \$390 for all three Proficiency subtests
- Some programs may offer free or reduced-cost testing for qualifying individuals.
