COURSE: English Language Development - Level 4B COURSE No. 2615

DESCRIPTION: This semester course is designed for students who perform at an overall score of 4 on the English Learner Proficiency Assessments for California (ELPAC). English learners at this level have moderately developed oral (listening and speaking) and written (reading and writing) skills. They can sometimes use English to learn and communicate in meaningful ways in a range of topics and content areas. They need light to minimal linguistic support to engage in familiar social and academic contexts; they need moderate support to communicate on less familiar tasks and topics.

STANDARDS/OBJECTIVES: The curriculum will integrate various collaborative, interpretive and productive activities so that students will develop oral (listening and speaking) and written (reading and writing) skills. Upon completion of this course the student will be able to:

- Collaborative: Express increasingly complex feelings, needs, ideas, and opinions in a variety of settings; respond to questions using extended and more elaborate discourse. Initiate and sustain dialogue on a variety of grade-level academic and social topics.
- Interpretive: Comprehend concrete and many abstract topics and begin to recognize language subtleties in a variety of communication settings. Read increasingly complex text at grade level. Read technical text supported by pictures or graphics.
- Productive: Produce, initiate, and sustain interactions with increasing awareness of tailoring language to specific purposes and audiences.
 Write and express ideas to meet increasingly complex academic demands for specific purposes and audiences.
