



Consideration of a Transition to By-Trustee Area Elections

- The process of considering of whether to transition to a by-trustee area method of elections was clear, concise, transparent, and accessible to all members of the IUSD community
- The public was educated about the IUSD's possible transition to by-trustee area voting not only through informal community meetings and public hearings, but also through consistent and extensive public outreach strategies



Timeline of Events

March 13	Board of Education adopted Resolution No. 17-18-28: Intent to Initiate the Process of Establishing Trustee Areas and Elections By-Trustee Areas
March- April	The District held Community Information Meetings about the process and obtained feedback on the trustee area map criteria
March 27	 Public Hearing No. 1: The public was invited to provide input regarding the composition of the proposed trustee areas
April 11	 Public Hearing No. 2: The public was invited to provide input regarding the composition of the proposed trustee areas. After which, the Board adopted Resolution No. 17-18-36: Establishing Criteria for Consideration of Developing Trustee Areas
April 17	 Three proposed trustee area maps and potential sequence of elections became available for public review
May 8	 Public Hearing No. 3: The public was invited to provide input regarding the content of the draft maps and the proposed sequence of elections, if applicable
May 22	 Three additional proposed trustee area maps and potential sequence of elections became available for public review
May 29	 Public Hearing No. 4: The public was invited to provide input regarding the content of the draft maps and the proposed sequence of elections, if applicable Public Hearing No. 5: The Board adopted a map and sequence of elections for approval by the Orange County Committee on School District Organization
June 20	 The Orange County Committee on School District Organization will conduct a public hearing within IUSD boundaries to consider approval of the proposed trustee area map and sequence of elections

Dear Community Member,

I am writing to provide you with information regarding a matter under consideration by the Irvine Unified School District (IUSD)

On March 13, 2018, the IUSD Board of Education adopted Resolution No. 17-18-28; Intent to Initiate the Process of Establishing Trustee Areas and Elections By-Trustee Areas. The purpose of this resolution is to commence the process to consider establishing trustee areas for the method of electing members of the IUSD Board of Education. It is important to note, this consideration or process will have no effect on school district or student attendance boundaries.

As background, the IUSD Board of Education members are currently elected by an at-large method. Under an at-large method of election, registered voters within the school district's boundaries can vote for any IUSD Board of Education candidate. To be eligible in an at-large election, candidates are required to reside anywhere within IUSD boundaries. Under a by-trustee area electoral system, eligible IUSD Board of Education candidates would be required to reside within a particular trustee area and IUSD Board of Education members would be elected only by registered voters of that same trustee area

With the passage of the California Voting Rights Act, many school districts and other municipalities throughout the state have gone through a process to consider their election method systems. As a result of the adoption of Resolution No. 17-18-28, the IUSD Board of Education has initiated the consideration of our election process. As the next step in this process, the District will hold two community information nights and two public hearings in order to collect community comments and feedback prior to the creation of any potential trustee area maps.

A subsequent phase of this process includes creation of at least two potential trustee area maps, which will then be submitted to the Board of Education and made available to the public on the District website and at the IUSD Administration Office. The District will then hold two additional public hearings in order to receive community feedback on these potential maps. When available, public meeting dates will be provided to the public and available on our District website.

As previously communicated, the IUSD Board of Education has been engaged in an extensive process to consider transitioning to a by-trustee area method of electing members of the IUSD Board of Education. During the May 29 Board Meeting, after hearing a presentation, conducting two public hearings, and reviewing multiple proposed trustee area maps, the Board unanimously voted to transition from the current at-large election method to a by-trustee area election method and unanimously selected the map that the Board agreed best met the approved criteria.

Each Board Member communicated their interest and intent to continue to represent all Irvine communities, residents, and students as a unified Board, committed to providing the highest quality educational experience IUSD can envision.

Residents are invited to use the interactive map to learn which trustee area they reside in. Please note, this process has no effect on school district or student attendance

Next Steps:

On June 20, 2018, at 6 p.m., the County Committee on School District Organization will hold a public hearing, at IUSD's Administration Office, to review the process undertaken by IUSD and the selected trustee area map. If approved by the County Committee on School District Organization, the by-trustee area election method and selected map will be in place in time for the November 2018 election.





Criteria for Consideration of Developing Trustee Areas

The Board adopted Resolution 17-18-36, setting forth the following criteria to guide in the establishment of proposed trustee areas, in no particular order:

- Each trustee area shall contain a nearly equal number of inhabitants
- Trustee area borders shall be drawn in a manner that complies with the Federal Voting Rights Act;
- 3. Trustee areas shall consist of contiguous territory in as compact a form as possible given the other criteria set forth herein
- 4. Trustee area borders shall respect communities of interest as much as possible



Criteria for Consideration of Developing Trustee Areas

- 5. Trustee area borders shall consider school attendance zone boundaries, with emphasis on having multiple trustee areas within each District high school attendance area to the extent possible
- 6. Trustee area borders shall consider school attendance zone boundaries, with emphasis on having multiple District high school attendance areas within each trustee area to the extent possible
- Trustee area borders shall consider jurisdictional boundaries as much as possible



Criteria for Consideration of Developing Trustee Areas

- 8. Trustee area borders shall attempt to avoid head-to-head contests between incumbent members of the Board insofar as this does not conflict with federal or state law
- 9. Trustee areas known to be areas of higher-than-average population growth in the two to five years following the establishment of trustee areas may be underpopulated within the population deviation amounts allowed by law
- 10. The boundaries of the trustee areas shall observe topography and geography, such as man-made geographical features including freeways, highways and major streets, etc. as potential divisions between trustee areas, insofar as practicable



Preparation of Draft Trustee Area Maps

- The draft maps were prepared in alignment with the criteria set forth in Resolution 17-18-36
- A total of six draft maps were prepared; each one contained a proposed sequence of elections
- Maps were prepared to constitute the best available options within the confines of the law
- All maps are population-balanced and meet the requirements of Section 2 of the Federal Voting Rights Act





Preparation of Draft Trustee Area Maps

All six maps (Green, Yellow, and Purple I - IV):


- Are population balanced, contiguous, reasonably compact, and respect the voters' wishes by avoiding pairing trustees
- Have one trustee area that is 16% Latino CVAP
- Have two trustee areas where Asian-Americans are 40 to 45% of CVAP
- Have two trustee areas where Asian-Americans are 30 to 35% of CVAP
- Ensure that each High School Attendance Zone has at least two trustees represented
- Try to ensure that each trustee represents multiple High School Attendance Zones
 - True in the Yellow map and for all areas, except Area 3 in Green and Purple maps.
 In Green and Purple, Area 3 has only University High School residents







- The Area 3 piece of Woodbridge pulls back from Barranca Pkwy to Alton Pkwy
- Area 5 returns to pick up the Woodbridge area west of Culver Drive and north of Alton Pkwy
- Area 2 picks up the site of Woodbridge High School and the Meadow Park Elementary neighborhood
- Area 1/Area 4 border shifts west from Hwy 133 to Sand Canyon Ave
- Area 1 picks up from Area 5 the Deerfield Elem / Venado Middle School corner
