



- Decline of 7 students equates to 2.5% student population decrease at Linda Vista Elementary
- Combined with decreasing enrollment districtwide, this potentially increases the need to consolidate elementary schools

Community Identity



A strong community identity exists within the City of Laguna Hills. The Laguna Hills High School motto is, "One City, One School". This motto is frequently echoed by Laguna Hills community members and there is a strong sense of pride throughout the city regarding community unity.

With 82% of Lomas Laguna HOA students attending SVUSD schools, there is no demonstrated community support from parents of school age children to have their students attend schools in another district.

With 82% of Lomas Laguna HOA students attending SVUSD schools, it is reasonable to conclude that there is a "substantial community identity" with Laguna Hills.

Fiscal Impact



- Saddleback Valley Unified School District enrollment continues to decline
- 2024-25 budgeted ADA loss of 1,060.6 equaling \$13.3 million
- 2024-25 lost revenue due to declining enrollment projected at \$9.72 million
- 2024-25 Fiscal impact of losing 36 students is \$447,233
- Current three year Multi-Year Projections (MYP) indicate a \$15.2 million deficit in year 3
- Annexing this area would result in an additional \$1.2 million added to the MYP year 3 deficit

Fiscal Impact



- SVUSD community passed Measure B in 2000
- Granting petition would create a long term impact upon homes within SVUSD boundaries through increased bond tax burden
- Additional funding in future bonds would be decreased if petition is granted
- Property tax revenue loss roughly \$1,000,000 in 2024-25





Saddleback Valley Unified School Districts requests the panel deny request to transfer the Lomas Laguna territory to Capistrano Unified School District. SVUSD stands to be impacted fiscally, both in the near and long term. With more than 82% of students attending SVUSD schools there is a strong community connection to the Laguna Hills Community as well as SVUSD.
