School Health Screenings

All California public schools offer vision and hearing screening for kindergarten, 2nd grade, 5th grade, and 7th grade students. Additionally, 7th grade girls and 8th grade boys are offered Scoliosis (curvature of the spine) Screening. The School Health Screenings are scheduled for each CHEP site on the same days as picture day for each site (except for CHEP Central and South). The 7th grade girls are encouraged to wear a bathing suit top under their regular clothing on that day to make this screening more comfortable for them. A privacy screen will be provided. The screenings are quick, easy, free of charge, and all parents are urged to attend with their children. Please note the nurse will only be at each site from 9:00 a.m. till 2:00 p.m., so if you have a student in kindergarten, 2nd grade, 5th grade, 7th grade, or an 8th grade boy, remember to come for your pictures and health screening in the morning!

KRUEGERMANN'S PICKLES

Kruegermann's Pickles got their start 116 years ago! In 1896, Carl Kruegermann started producing pickles in the small German town of Luebbenau, located southeast of Berlin. Kurt Kruegermann, grandson of Carl, operated the business until he decided to flee what was then communist East Germany in 1961. The DDR government eventually took the business away. Kurt's family immigrated to Los Angeles with no money in their pockets or comprehension of the English language. In 1965, with business license and samples in hand, they went to work. Using "old world" recipes and high quality produce from California, he sold his products to European delicatessens, gourmet markets, and restaurants. From humble beginnings in their backyard garage, today they have grown to 25,000 sq ft of manufacturing and storage space and supply some of the finest food markets across many states.

The *Graber Olive House* is a historic facility in its 118th season! Graber olives grow on a 185-acre ranch in California's central valley near Porterville. They're carefully harvested, then trucked south to Ontario, California, home of the Graber Olive House. Every autumn, the Olive House turns into a beehive of activity as the olives are cured, sized and canned using the same machines and recipes invented by the original Mr. Graber over a hundred years ago.
