WASHINGTON D.C. AND EAST COAST TOUR By Laina Quinones (former CHEP student, now at PCHS)

Stone men frozen in time, a point in time. A moment when six men struggled to raise our nation's flag. One of the monuments my tour group visited on the 2010 CHEP trip to Washington D.C. and New York was the Iwo Jima Memorial. As we surveyed the memorial our tour guide, Greg St. Jacques painted for us a vivid image of the horrors that took place during the battle at Iwo Jima during WWII. The account that Mr. St. Jacques portrayed to the group seemed grotesque and too evil to have actually occurred. As he spoke I could see the bullets fly, the men crying out in bloody pain, and the dead bodies that lay in the aftermath. Tears welled in mothers and students' eyes, even Mr. St. Jacques became noticeably teary. Just as it seemed our tour guide was reaching the end of his story, an older man arrived at the memorial. Upon seeing him, Mr. St Jacques left our group and walked over to the man. For a few moments they conversed and then the man and Mr. St. Jacques made their way back to our tour group. Mr. St. Jacques had asked the man to speak about his experience as a WWII Marine. It was now that the truth of the evil of Iwo Jima was reaffirmed in my mind, and I could tell my fellow travelers were moved as well. This is just one of the impacting experiences I encountered on my CHEP trip to Washington D.C. and New York. My hope for you is that you will take advantage of the upcoming CHEP opportunity, and will love it just as much as I did.






