# PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

### FROM THE DESK OF OUR PRINCIPAL, JANE DONEY

It's February and we are already in the second semester of the school year- this year is flying by! As we look forward to what's ahead, please continue to check out the Common Core State Standards resources on our CHEP webpage so that you can include some active learning activities that will engage your child and deepen their learning!

With the introduction of the new Common Core State Standards (CCSS), please consider the following ideas related to teaching and learning. Hopefully they will provide you with information and ideas that inspire creativity and application of learning!

- Study the standards so that you're familiar with them. You can find them at: http://www.cde.ca.gov/re/cc/index.asp
- Watch the presentation by David Coleman (the 'architect' of the CCSS) on the OCDE website: <a href="http://ocde.us/CommonCoreCA">http://ocde.us/CommonCoreCA</a> for a helpful overview of CCSS
- Read "Five Things Every Teacher Should Be Doing to Meet the Common Core State Standards" <a href="http://ped.state.nm.us/ped/CCDocuments/5ThingsCCSS">http://ped.state.nm.us/ped/CCDocuments/5ThingsCCSS</a> Davis.pdf
- Check out this list of reading selections and books – fictional and information- listed by grade span and subject. There are many primary sources included! <a href="http://www.corestandards.org/assets/Appendix\_B.pdf">http://www.corestandards.org/assets/Appendix\_B.pdf</a>)
- Ask questions that require your student to go back to the text. Have them show you where they found their answers. (These are called "Text Dependent Questions.")

- Create word walls or journals to encourage precise vocabulary in all subjects so that it becomes natural in students discussions and writing in a subject area. Encourage "College Talk" ©
- In Math, teach the process, not just the short cut.
   Have students' write out an explanation for at least one problem per page, as appropriate. Precise vocabulary is important!
- Find ways to celebrate and share your students' learning, such as at our CHEP Expo, the Young Author's Faire, and our Variety Show. (Information on these events can be found in this newsletter.)
- Finally- please enjoy the opportunity you have as the teacher! Use the textbook and standards as your road map, because there IS a destination (goal) in mind, but don't be afraid to take those "Blue Highways"- aka, the scenic route. See yourself as the facilitator of student learning, rather than the storehouse of all knowledge, which frees you to explore with your student as you model for them that we are ALL continual learners and evaluators. Learning should never end for anyone!

#### EXPO CATAPULT COMPETITION Tuesday, April 1 During the EXPO Extravaganza

Calling all future engineers, scientists, and builders. Our EXPO contest this year features the return of the catapult. (Trebuchets are okay too.) We will be testing

student catapult projects outdoors to find the long-distance winner (lower grade and upper grade.) We will be launching a standard pink pearl eraser. Catapults may be made of any material or combination of materials, but should not cost



over \$15 to build. They may not be motorized. They must fit in your car! Parents may help with projects, especially if tools are used, but all designs should be student-generated.



# AMAZING MEMORIES Deborah McIntire, CHEP teacher

One of the highlights of my twenty-four year career at CHEP occurred in 2006 when I had the privilege to serve with Kim Dyk as teacher coordinator for CHEP's Washington D.C./New York trip. I had the opportunity to witness hundreds of "AHA" moments as student's saw and experienced first hand what had previously only been a fact in a history book.

The Smithsonian, the world's largest museum complex, proved to be fertile ground for our CHEP students. At the Air and Space Museum, students were mesmerized as they viewed everything from the Wright brother's Flier to



the Apollo Mission capsule. At the American History Museum, viewing the massive flag that inspired The Star Spangled Banner was emotional and

impactful for all of us. However, the students were also extremely interested in George Washington's personal effects...especially his false teeth. Of course, the women and girls were enthralled with the beautiful inaugural gown collection of our First Ladies.

I was delighted as a group of Junior High boys clustered around Impressionist paintings and Dutch Masters at the National Museum of Art. Perhaps one of my favorite overheard comments was, "Wow, that dude can paint!" This was uttered from an eighth grader who previously just knew he would NOT like the Art Gallery.

Still smiling from this response, I moved to join a fourth grader and her father. Her comment perfectly captures the joy of first hand experience as she viewed Van

Gogh's Starry Night. "Daddy, that's just like the picture we saw at CHEP's art class, only it looks better now."

The days and evenings were packed full of amazing learning opportunities...viewing copies of the Declaration and the Constitution...watching Congress in action...touring Mount Vernon and the Marine Academy...actually being inside the White House...viewing the many awe-inspiring monuments honoring our nation's heroes. Each opportunity built a growing sense of understanding and appreciation for our country's history and the sacrifices and courage required by so many. The gigantic, seated statue of Lincoln seemed to embody not only his spirit but the majestic presence of America's founders.

Even though I participated in this trip eight years ago, the memories are still vividly imprinted in my mind and spirit. Two years previously, I had taken this same CHEP trip with my eighth grade son. Now as a college senior, he still fondly remembers and refers to this trip. I certainly hope you and your family will give serious consideration to investing in this amazing opportunity to bring history alive.
