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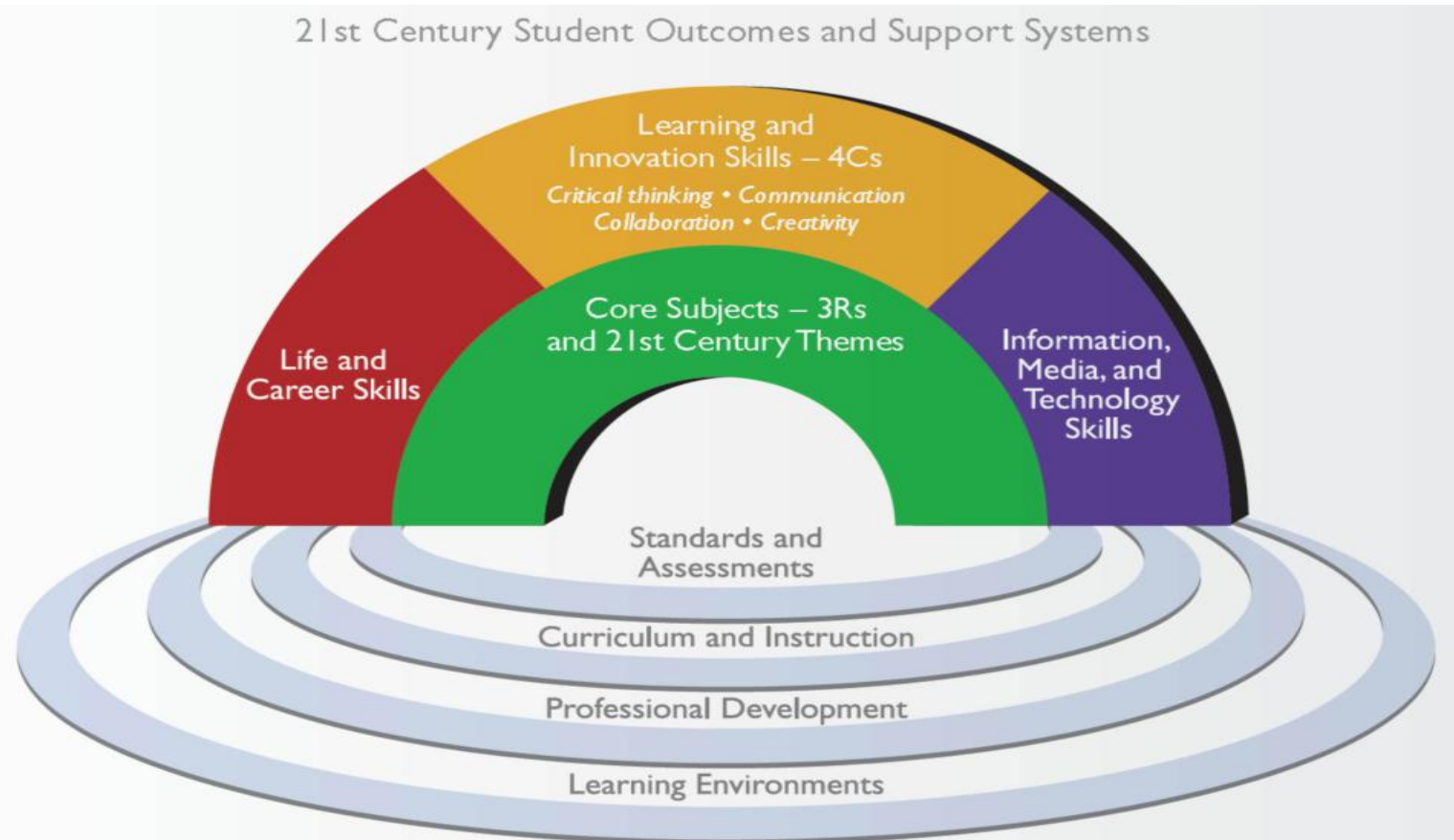

# Development of the Common Core State Standards (CCSS)

- 2009: National Governors' Association (NGA) and Council of Chief State School Officers (CCSSO) develop CCSS.
- 2009: College and Career Readiness Standards
- 2010: California Legislature enacted Ed. Code 60605.7 requiring California participation in CCSS Consortium.
- August 2, 2010: California State Board of Education voted unanimously for California to adopt and implement CCSS.

# Rationale for the Common Core State Standards (CCSS) – The 4 Cs

## *Cognitive Skills*

- Critical Thinking
- Creativity

## *Interpersonal Skills*

- Collaboration
- Communication



# Rationale for Adoption by the California State Board of Education

- Equips students for critical thinking and problem solving, creativity and innovation, communication and collaboration – 21<sup>st</sup> century skills for college and career success
- Introduces critical-thinking assessments that require students to use their knowledge
- Focuses attention on conceptually rich standards aligned across states
- Better integrates meaningful uses of technology into all aspects of learning

# California Educational Governance: Key Board Responsibilities

## **State Board of Education**

- Adopts policies for elementary and secondary education (Education Code § 33031).
- Adopts standards and approves curriculum frameworks (Education Code § 60207).
- Reviews and adopts basic instructional materials, to be furnished without cost, for use in grades one through eight (Education Code § 60200).

# California Educational Governance: Key Board Responsibilities

## County Board of Education

- Adopts rules and regulations not inconsistent with the laws of this state, for their own governance (Education Code § 1040).
- Ensures that textbooks are aligned with state standards (Ed Code § 60119).
- Ensures that the course of study adopted for county programs complies with state requirements and standards (Ed Code § 48645.3 and 1983[d]).



# California Educational Governance: Key Board Responsibilities

## Local School District Boards

- Sets direction for the school district.
- Adopts curriculum for the school district's schools.
- Ensures that textbooks are aligned with state standards.



# Implementation

## **2013-2014**

- Continuing implementation of CCSS (supported by special implementation funding)
- Pilot testing of Measurement of Academic Performance and Progress (MAPP) based on CCSS (STAR testing is proposed to be suspended)

## **2014-2015**

- Full implementation of MAPP assessment system
