The AP Fellows APSI Scholarship is available to AP teachers in 2024. This scholarship is for teachers at schools with a majority underrepresented minority and/or low-income student population.

- Scholarship amount: \$1,000 max
- Eligible AP subjects: All AP subjects EXCEPT AP Capstone (Seminar & Research)
