Oral Reading Fluency (ORF) is the ability to read aloud quickly and accurately. This is an important skill for developing readers. It can be measured rapidly and is highly predictive of comprehension and other important measures of student reading ability. Early literacy has been identified as a critical foundation for students' future academic and life success. This series will:

- Examine the elements of fluency including, accuracy, rate and prosody
- Explore the changing patterns of growth in ORF during the COVID-19 Pandemic
- Evaluate the role of assessment
