

GRANT-FUNDED GRADUATE COURSEWORK FOR TEACHERS



READING INTERVENTION IN ENGLISH AND SPANISH

Project CLEAR is a grant-funded professional learning opportunity designed for teachers interested in gaining expertise in reading intervention. This knowledge will help teachers expand availability and access to literacy acceleration, prevention, and intervention for their diverse students, including students who are English learners, students in dual language programs, and students with disabilities, including those with dyslexia and/or phonological processing issues.

Through this one-year program, participants will learn comprehensive literacy strategies in schools and K-12 interventions for students who have reading, writing, and language-based needs.





INCLUDED IN THE PROGRAM

- Tuition for 8 postgraduate units over two semesters (including certification in Reading Recovery/ Descubriendo la Lectura)
- Training fees
- \$680 for student instructional
- \$10,000 stipend upon completion of the 8 units

This grant-funded opportunity is designed for classroom teachers and reading specialists.

READING INTERVENTION IN ENGLISH AND SPANISH

Project CLEAR is a grant-funded opportunity to provide professional development to educators interested in becoming a Teacher Leader with expertise in reading intervention. These Teacher Leaders can expand availability and access to literacy acceleration, prevention, and intervention for diverse students in their district or school, including students who are English learners, students in dual language programs, and students with disabilities, including those with dyslexia and/or phonological processing issues.

Through this program, participants will become Teacher Leaders who can train and coach teachers to implement comprehensive literacy strategies in schools and K-12 interventions for students who have reading, writing, and language-based needs.




THE PROGRAM

- Tuition for 16 postgraduate units over two semesters (including certification in Reading Recovery/ Descubriendo la Lectura)
- Training Fees
- Professional books
- Student instructional materials
- Up to \$1,600 for registration fees and travel expenses for the national Teacher Leader Institute
- Professional development in the program's second year
- \$10,000 stipend upon successful completion of 16 units

This grant-funded opportunity is designed for teachers on special assignment, district resource teachers, teacher leaders, and reading specialists.





