Tier 1

Tier 1 PBIS professional learning focuses on the co-creation of school-wide behavioral supports through a team-led process.

Year 1 Installing: Tier 1 teams engage in 4 days of in-person learning to install PBIS universal systems, practices, and data.

Tier 1 - Year 1 Dates: 09/09/25, 11/19/2025, 02/12/2026, 03/31/2026 - 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

Year 2 Implementing: Professional learning builds to include data-based conversations, deeper implementation in the classroom, and action planning.

Tier 1 - Year 2 Dates: 2026-2027 - TBD Cost: \$6,500 per school Team



Tier 2

Tier 2 PBIS professional learning prioritizes using data to identify practices that will support students who need supplemental supports using systems to support implementation.

Year 1 Installing: Tier 2 teams engage in 4 days of in-person learning to install supplemental interventions, including exploring and building the supporting systems and data for implementation. **Tier 2 - Year 1 Dates:** 09/30/25, 12/02/25, 02/12/25, 03/19/26 - 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

Year 2 Implementing: Professional learning builds to fully implement Check-in Check-out, explore Tier 2 practices for contextual fit, and increase Tier 2 fidelity of implementation.

Tier 2 - Year 2 Dates: 2026-2027 - TBD Cost: \$6,500 per school Team



Tier 3

Tier 3 supports focus on the individual behaviors of students whose needs are not met by universal and secondary practices. OCDE currently offers training on Prevent Teach Reinforce (PTR) which is an evidence-based process for assessing students' needs and responding with suitable prevention, teaching, and reinforcement strategies.

Tier 3 Installing: Tier 3 team engages with professional learning to build systems and data for identifying & responding to intensive student needs, while a student-centered team will build a comprehensive behavior plan.

Tier 3 - Year 1 Dates: 10/02/25, 10/29/25, 11/20/25, 01/14/26 - 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

Tier 3 Implementing: Tier 3 team continues to build sustainable systems and data practices while student-centered teams receive more practice and technical assistance for behavior support planning. If interested in PTR training, please contact Ginny Joseph vjoseph@ocde.us
