### Due December 4, 2020

The AVID senior scholarship application template, descriptions, and link to the AVID Community Scholarship online system will be posted on the OCDE AVID Scholarships page by October 6, 2020. To ensure more equitable access to scholarship funds, there have been changes to the scholarship submission process. Rather than doing a broad-based application invitation, the change we are asking AVID Senior Class Teachers to nominate 1 applicant for every 15 AVID students, plus their Senior Standout. ## 8<sup>th</sup> Grade Standouts

### Due February 25, 2021

The AVID 8<sup>th</sup> Grade Standout application will be online. AVID 8<sup>th</sup> Grade Teachers will be invited to the scholarship portal. Teachers will invite the AVID 8<sup>th</sup> Grade Standout to the portal. Students will complete the online application, upload their essay, signed authorization, and picture. Teachers will upload the recommendation letter and student transcript. We hope to have the online application posted by October 30 and template posted on the OCDE AVID Scholarships page by mid- October. Use the template as a tool for all students to practice completing a scholarship application. Practice ensures the standout will have a draft to use when the online application opens.
