YOUTH SERVING ORGANIZATIONS

The Orange County Friday Night Live Partnership (OCFNLP) provides opportunities for positive and healthy youth development by engaging youth as active leaders and resources in their communities. The research-based program encourages youth to take responsibility by creating and coordinating alcohol, tobacco, and other drug prevention activities and community service projects that benefit their peers and communities. This youth-driven model develops 21st century competencies in the areas of leadership, communication, team building, and problem solving.

OCFNLP programs, including Friday Night Live (youth in grades 9-12), Club Live (youth in grades 6-8), and Friday Night Live Kids (youth in grades 4-6) can be implemented in youth serving organizations including after-school programs, resource and community centers, and youth ministries.

The Orange County Department of Education provides:

- A program open to youth in grades 4-12 at no cost to the organization
- Ongoing technical assistance, resources, and support for implementation of proven effective alcohol, tobacco, and drug prevention strategies
- Skill development trainings for youth
- Advisor training and support
- Site specific program evaluation data
- Opportunities for youth to make positive contributions to their communities
