PLAN FOR PROVIDING EDUCATIONAL SERVICES TO ALL EXPELLED STUDENTS IN BREA OLINDA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT

As required by Education Code 48926, the Orange County Superintendent of Schools has developed an expulsion plan in conjunction with the Superintendents of the school districts in Orange County. The plan provides for educational services to all expelled students in the county for school years 2021-2022, 2022-2023 and 2023-2024. A student whose behavior has resulted in an expulsion is provided a rehabilitation plan which ensures placement in an educational program and establishes the criteria for return to the Brea Olinda Unified School District. All educational alternatives provided by Orange County school districts are not available to all expelled students. The type of offense, location of offense, grade level and nature of the student's individualized needs; all have the potential to affect the educational alternatives available to the student during the period of expulsion. Students expelled for any of the offenses listed in subdivision (a) or (c) of Section 48915 of the California Education Code shall not be permitted to enroll in any district-operated program during the period of expulsion unless it is a community day school (E.C. 48915.2).

As indicated in the Orange County Expulsion plan, the options available to Brea Olinda Unified School District after an expulsion decision include, but are not limited to the following:

- 1. Expulsion, suspended order, with placement on the same school campus [E.C. 48917 (a)].
- 2. Expulsion, suspended order, with placement on a different school campus within the district [E.C.48917 (a)].
- 3. Expulsion with referral to a district alternative suspension/expulsion classroom, if available (E.C. 48660).
- 4. Expulsion with subsequent transfer to another district.
- 5. Expulsion with referral to the Orange County Department of Education, Alternative, Community and Correctional Education Schools and Services (ACCESS) (E.C. 1981).

Service Gap #2

Limited Special Education Placements in ACCESS. The Orange County Department of Education is committed to expanded program options for students with exceptional needs that have been expelled from school district programs. As identified through communications with SELPA and District-Special Education Directors, programs for emotionally disturbed and dual diagnosis (Emotionally Disturbed and Developmentally Delayed) students have been developed in some school districts as well as the OCDE Special Schools program. In addition, ACCESS continues to evaluate its Special Education services to provide a continuum of placement options. When a student's unique needs cannot be accommodated through existing OCDE program alternatives, the district of residence will continue to facilitate placement to meet the unique needs of individual students through district and non-public agency/school placements.

Service Gap #2 Progress

We have utilized our OCDE ACCESS program to address students who are expelled with Special Needs through Non Public Schools or OCDE Special Schools Programs.

Service Gap #3

Students sometimes do not meet the provisions of the expulsion rehabilitation plan and fall behind in their academic studies. In these cases, they are at high risk of not completing their necessary credits and are at a higher risk of dropping out of school.

Service Gap #3 Progress

The district works on credit recovery options with our alternative high school. Summer School and Apex are options we use to fill the gap. District will set up a formal process for evaluating students' progress when they are not in the district on a quarterly basis. Assign an AP and Counselor to supervise this process

Service Gap #4

Mental Health Services: Orange County School Districts are seeing an increased need for mental health services and a shortage of affordable and accessible options for students.

Service Gap #4 Progress

District has Project Kinship K-12 to support at promise students and their families. District has created a MFT intern program with Intern support at all school sites. District has also invested in a full time MFT at the high school level.

District has invested in teacher training in trauma informed care, Social Emotional Learning and access and equity.

District has BASE education to support social emotional learning. District has also contracted with California Youth Services for intervention programs related to drugs and alcohol and curbing juvenile delinquency program.

College Course Preparation Access for County Community Students. Within the ACCESS program there is an option for students to utilize GradPoint, an online course option with "a-g" approved satisfying the subject requirements for admission into the University of California and California State University systems. AGREEMENT AND STIPULATION FOR FULL EXPULSION (SUSPENDED ENFORCEMENT) SAMPLE

This **Agreement** is made and entered into by and between (**student last name**) (**student first name**), **DOB**: **mo/da/year** (hereinafter referred to as the "Student"), (**Name of parents**) (hereinafter referred to as "Parent(s)/Guardian(s)"), and the **Brea Olinda Unified School District** (hereinafter referred to as the "District").

RECITALS

- 1. A Notice of Expulsion ("Notice"), pertaining to the Student (see Exhibit A: Suspension Letter attached to this Agreement) was provided to the Parent(s)/Guardian(s); and
- 2. The Notice includes allegations of specific acts committed or engaged in by the Student, which acts are grounds for expulsion under applicable provisions of the *California Education Code*, including, but not limited to, Sections 48900 and 48915; and,
- 3. The Student and Parent(s)/Guardian(s) have been provided along with the Notice the applicable provisions of the California Education Code, including Education Code sections 48900, 48915, and 48918, as well as District rules and regulations governing expulsions; and
- 4. The Student and Parent(s)/Guardian(s) have been advised by District representatives that they have a right to consult with and/or otherwise engage counsel to represent them during any proceedings involving the Notice and/or this **Agreement**; and
- 5. The Student and Parent(s)/Guardian(s) have met with District representatives to discuss the allegations contained in the Notice and applicable provisions of the California Education Code relating to expulsions; and
- 6. The Student and Parent(s)/Guardian(s) fully understand the charges contained in the Notice, and the

meaning and consequences of an expulsion order which may result from such charges; and

- 7. At an upcoming Board of Education meeting, the District Governing Board will consider and take action on the issue of expulsion based on the Student's admissions and waiver of right to an expulsion hearing as set forth in this **Agreement**; and
- 8. The parties have determined that resolution of the issues raised in the Notice would best be served by an expedited and abbreviated process, which process would ultimately be beneficial to and in the best interest of the Student, the Parent(s)/Guardian(s), and the District; and
- 9. This Agreement is consistent with the intent of applicable provisions of the California Education Code relating to expulsions.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties agree as follows:

SECTION 1. Recitals Approved.

The Parties agree that the above Recitals are true and correct.

SECTION 2. Purpose.

The purpose of the Agreement is to establish a framework for the amicable, beneficial, and expedited resolution of the issues raised in the Notice (Exhibit A: Suspension Letter).

SECTION 3. Acknowledgement of Notice/Allegations.

The Student and Parent(s)/Guardian(s) fully acknowledge, understand, and admit the following:

- A. Violation of *California Education Code*:
 - **1. 48900.2 Sexual Harassment**
 - 2. 48900 (i) Obscene act habitual profanity or vulgarity
- B. Incident Summary: Student admitted to showing 3 students a pornographic video during lunch (cyber-sexual harassment)
- C. Student shall be expelled from the Brea Olinda Unified School District effective (day of the week), (month) (date), (year) through (day of the week), (month) (date), (year). The enforcement of the expulsion shall be suspended during the above-referenced expulsion period upon Board of Education approval allowing the student to attend school within the

Brea Olinda Unified School District. Student shall be transferred to: (name of school/facility)

- D. Parent(s)/Guardian(s) and Student have received the Notice and have carefully read the allegations contained in the Notice and the applicable California Education Code sections and have had the opportunity to discuss the allegations with District representatives, and fully understand the allegations and the meaning and consequences of an expulsion order; and
- E. The Parent(s)/Guardian(s) and the Student acknowledge by this Agreement that they have been told they have a right to a due process hearing to contest the allegations contained in the Notice, including a challenge that the identified acts constitute grounds for expulsion, and that the purpose and function of an expulsion hearing would be to decide if the allegations have been substantiated, whether they constitute grounds for expulsion, and whether the Student should be expelled.
- F. If substantiated, each and every specific act outlined in the Notice, either independently and/or collectively, is a ground for expulsion under California Education Code section(s) 48900 et seq.; and
- G. The specific acts committed or engaged in by the Student, as alleged in the Notice, did in fact occur.

SECTION 4. Waiver.

The Student and Parent(s)/Guardian(s) relinquish their right to contest any expulsion order, and make a knowing and voluntary waiver of their right to have an expulsion hearing, including the right to: (a) all notices and timelines required by statute, rule, or regulation; (b) be represented by legal counsel at such expulsion hearing; (c) inspect and obtain copies of all documents which would have been used at the hearing; (d) confront and question all witnesses who would have testified at the hearing; (e) question all other evidence presented; and (f) present oral and documentary evidence on the Student's behalf, including witnesses.

Right to Appeal to County Board of Education: The Student and Parent(s)/Guardian(s) understand that under Education Code sections 48918 (j) (1) and 48919, they have a right to appeal within thirty (30) days

of the expulsion order of the District and to be given written notice of this right. However, by this Agreement, the Student and Parent(s)/Guardian(s) hereby relinquish their right, and make a voluntary waiver of their right to appeal the District's order of expulsion to the Orange County Board of Education, and the right to receive notice of this right in the notice of the District's decision to expel.

SECTION 5. Governing Board Approval.

This Agreement is conditioned upon review and approval of the District's Board of Education.

SECTION 6. Application for Readmission; Rehabilitation Program.

Student shall be expelled from the Brea Olinda Unified School District effective (day of the week), (month) (date), (year) through (day of the week), (month) (date), (year). The enforcement of the expulsion shall be suspended during the above-referenced expulsion period upon Board of Education approval allowing the student to attend school within the Brea Olinda Unified School District. Student shall be transferred to: (name of facility)

Rehabilitation Program. During the period of expulsion, the Student must successfully complete a Rehabilitation Program, which is listed below. The final approval and content of the Rehabilitation Program shall be within the discretion of the District's Board of Education, and shall include the following:

- A. Student must obey all laws of the State and Federal Government.
- B. Student must enroll in and maintain attendance in good standing in an educational program meeting the requirements of California's compulsory attendance laws. Student will attend (name of facility).
- C. Students who are expelled to ACCESS, or whose expulsion has been suspended to any other school site, may be immediately expelled after review by the Coordinator of Student Services or the Principal of the County School if there are any violations of a serious nature pursuant to District Board policy, Administrative regulations, and Education Code.
- D. You have the right to enroll student in a private or parochial school (at parent's expense), or in another school district if the pupil lives in another district, **but you must inform that school of student's expulsion**.

- E. Not be on any campus except the school that the student is assigned to attend unless accompanied by parent(s)/guardian(s).
- F. **Counseling:** Student is required to participate in an outside counseling program. Counseling should assist Student in the following areas:
 - 1. Decision Making
 - 2. Peer Relationships
 - 3. Peer Relationships
 - 4. Digital Citizenship
- G. Perform 20 hours of community service, which is to be completed by (day of the week),
 (month) (date), (year). Prior approval of the specific community service is required by the
 District Representative or administrator at the community school site.
- H. Complete a 3 to 5 page reflective paper on "How has this event/choice impacted my education my family and my future?"
- I. Participate in and follow the rules of a behavior contract developed by the school administration in conjunction with student and family in order to successfully meet the terms of this agreement.
- J. During the period of expulsion the student must test negative on 12 Panel Drug Tests administered once a month by a reputable drug-testing or medical facility during the period of expulsion. Copies of the drug test results must be provided to the Coordinator of Student Services upon application for readmission to the Brea Olinda Unified School District.
- K. Attend and successfully complete 10 credits (or more) in summer school if needed.
- L. Present a letter from his or her probation officer indicating the conduct of the pupil during the expulsion period (not necessary if student does not have a probation officer).
- M. Prior to the conclusion of the expulsion term, Mayu shall demonstrate:
 - 1. Appropriate academic progress,
 - 2. Positive attitude, and
 - 3. Regular school attendance.

SECTION 7. Reinstatement.

Pending the satisfactory completion of the Rehabilitation Program outlined in **SECTION 6** of this Agreement, the Student may apply for readmission to the District. Any determination as to whether the Rehabilitation Program has been satisfactorily completed shall be vested in the sole discretion of the Superintendent or his/her designee.

SECTION 8. Effective date.

The effective date of this Agreement shall be the date approved by the District's Board of Education, tentatively scheduled for (day of the week), (month) (date), (year).

SECTION 9. Amendments.

Neither this Agreement nor any of the terms hereof may be amended, modified, altered, waived or terminated except by a written instrument approved by the Superintendent or his/her designee.

SECTION 10. Integration.

This Agreement constitutes the entire understanding and agreement between the parties, and supersedes all previous negotiations, understandings, and preliminary agreements, whether written or oral, between them.

SECTION 11. Approval.

This Stipulated Expulsion. is subject to and contingent upon Board of Education approval and, as a result, the Parent(s)/Guardian(s) and Student agree to waive the expulsion timelines in Education Code section 48918 until ten (10) school days after Board Action within which time the District will make a new recommendation.

"These proceedings will be tape-recorded. Under the Education Code, the Board of Trustees is permitted to conduct a hearing of this type in closed session unless the student demanded that the hearing be conducted in public by notifying the school district five days in advance.

<u>Chairman (or Board President)</u>: "The District and the student are permitted to call and cross-examine witnesses and introduce documentary evidence. The technical rules of evidence will not apply, but all witnesses will be required to testify under oath. Will all persons who may testify in this matter please stand, raise your right hand and be sworn."

All witnesses, including the student if he or she wishes to address the board, should stand and the chairman should read the following oath.

"Do each of you swear or affirm that the testimony you may give in this hearing shall be the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth?"

The chairman should wait until the witnesses have responded.

Chairman (or Board President): "Unless either the District or the student objects, all witnesses will be permitted to remain in the room during the hearing. If either party objects, all witnesses will be excluded until they are called to testify. However, the District and the student will be permitted to have one or more representatives present to assist in presenting evidence throughout the hearing. Does either party wish to exclude witnesses?"

The district and the student are asked to respond. If either party requests that witnesses be excluded, the chairman shall so order.

"District requests that no students' last names, other than

(student's name)

be used in this hearing because to do so would violate those students' confidentiality and privacy rights under state and federal law."

<u>Chairman (or Board President)</u>: "The burden of proof in this matter rests with the District. I call upon the District's representative to make an opening statement at this time."

The district's representative makes an opening statement.

<u>Chairman (or Board President)</u>: "At this time, the student's representative may make an opening statement or may wait until the District has completed its evidence. Do you wish to make an opening statement at this time?"

The student's representative responds and makes an opening statement if he requests to do so at this time.

<u>Chairman (or Board President)</u>: "The District will now present witnesses and evidence. After each witness' testimony, the student or his representative may cross-examine the witness. Re-direct and re-cross examination is permitted and panel members may ask clarifying questions. The District may proceed."

The district, through its representatives, calls each witness in succession. The student's representatives may cross-examine each witness. If documents are submitted in evidence, they shall be received by the chairman and marked consecutively as the district's exhibits No. 1, No. 2, etc.

After the district indicates that it has completed its evidence, the student may make an opening statement if he has not done so and then may proceed to call his witnesses and introduce his documents in the same manner as the district has done, and the district may cross-examine the student's witnesses.

<u>Chairman (or Board President)</u>: "The student may make an opening statement if he/she has not done so and then may proceed to call his/her witnesses and introduce his/her documents in the same manner as the district has done. The district may cross-examine the student's witnesses."

The student, through its representatives, calls each witness in succession. The district's representatives may cross-examine each witness. If documents are submitted in evidence, they shall be received by the chairman and marked consecutively as the student's exhibits No. 1, No. 2, etc.

<u>Chairman (or Board President)</u>: "All evidence has been received. The student's representative may make a closing statement."

The student's representative makes a closing statement.

<u>Chairman (or Board President)</u>: "The District, which has the burden of proof, may make its closing statement at this time."

The district makes a closing statement.

"At this time, the Administrative Panel will retire to reach a decision."

The Panel retires or clears the room and discusses the matter and votes.

"The question before the Administrative Panel is: 'Shall (student's name)
be expelled from the Brea Olinda Unified School District?' I call for a roll call vote."

Each Administrative Panel Member votes YES, to sustain the expulsion, or NO, to reinstate the student.

Re-enrollment Procedures for Expelled Students

The following procedures have been established by the governing board for the re-enrollment of students who have been expelled from district schools. The Education Code provides that an expulsion order shall remain in effect until the governing board orders the readmission of a student. It further provides that at the time of expulsion, the governing board shall set a date, not later than the last day of the semester following the semester in which the expulsion occurred, when the student may apply for readmission. When the expelled student applies for readmission, the governing board or "designee" may evaluate whether to re-enroll the student. Upon completion of the readmission process, the governing board shall not be required to readmit the student (EC§ 48916).

NOTE: Currently Federal Law is being implemented requiring school districts to expel students found possessing a weapon for a minimum of one year.

- 1. At the time an expulsion of a student is ordered, a **Plan of Rehabilitation** will be developed which specifies the conditions for readmission. This plan shall be included with the **Application for Readmission**.
- 2. The **Application for Readmission** form must be signed by the student and parent/guardian and submitted to the superintendent or designee in order to initiate the readmission procedure. The superintendent or designee will call a meeting with the student, parent/guardian, and the principal of the school who may receive the student. An opportunity will be provided for all parties to give input in determining if the plan of rehabilitation has been successfully completed.
- 3. The decision of the superintendent, with approval by the Board of Education, will be mailed to the parent/guardian within five (5) school days. Any appeal of this decision must be made in writing within five (5) school days to the Board of Education. The appeal will be held in closed session (unless the parent/guardian requests at the time the appeal is requested that it be heard in open session) at the next regularly scheduled Board of Education meeting.
- 4. Admission of a student expelled from another school district: Requests must be made on the Application for Readmission form. Attach the Plan of Rehabilitation from the previous school district or write the conditions that were specified in the expulsion order on the Application for Readmission. Otherwise the same procedures and timelines described above will be followed.
