Access to Education in Federal Law: Rights of students to receive related nursing services or care to allow them to: <i>Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA)</i> , and <i>Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973</i> .	Licensed vocational nurses (LVNs), if employed by the LEA, must be clinically supervised by a credentialed school nurse, school physician, or public health nurse.
