Top educators to be honored at 2017 Orange County Teachers of the Year event

COSTA MESA, Calif., OCTOBER 18, 2016 – Sixty-three educators from Orange County school districts and community colleges will be recognized on Tuesday, Oct. 25 at a dinner celebration coordinated by the Orange County Department of Education.
