Based on an energy audit, you can determine what changes can be made to your lifestyle to help conserve* energy. Use this simple energy audit to help you determine where you can decrease your energy use at school.



Answer the following questions and make your pledge below.

1.	Does your classroom turn off the lights when leaving for recess, lunch, and the end of the day?	yes	no
2.	Does the office turn off the lights at the end of the day?	yes	no
3.	Does the cafeteria turn off the lights after recess and lunch?	yes	no
4.	Does your classroom turn off their computers when they are not in use?	yes	no
5.	Do you use fans or open a window or door instead of using the air conditioner?	yes	no
6.	Does your classroom set the heater at 70°F or lower?	yes	no
