Adaptation A behavior or characteristic that helps a plant or animal survive in the

environment

Biotic Living

Classification The grouping of things based on certain characteristics

Coastal sage scrub An ecosystem of short, drought adapted soft leafed shrubs, in which

California sagebrush is the most common species

Consumer A living thing that gets energy by eating other living things

Ecosystem All the biotic and abiotic things that interact in a particular area

Energy pyramid A diagram showing the energy available at each level in a food chain

Food chain A series of events in which one organism eats another

Invertebrate An animal that does not have a backbone

Prediction A guess about what you think will happen based on observations and

experiences

Producer A living thing that makes its own food

Tidepool A shallow pool along the coastline that traps ocean water during low tide

Vertebrate An animal that has a backbone
