



Cumulative Year-to-Date


Average Annual Rainfall: 12.9"

Average: 12.56"


4-Year Deficit: 25.3" (2011-12 to Present)

2014-15: **7.30"**






Northern California Runoff

Updated Emergency Regulations - Consumers

- Continuation of prohibitions on:
 - Washing of hardscape
 - Irrigation runoff
 - Car washing without a positive shut-off hose nozzle
 - Potable water use for non-recirculating water features
- New additions:
 - Restaurants and bars to offer drinking water service <u>only</u> on request
 - Motels and motels to offer patrons the <u>option</u> of not having their towels and linens washed daily
 - Prohibit irrigation during and 48 hours after measurable rainfall
 - "measurable" is a local determination





Additions to Updated Emergency Regulations – <u>Water</u> Suppliers

- Implement level of Water Shortage Contingency Plan containing mandatory restrictions on the number of days of outdoor irrigation
 - Includes all other actions in that level of WSCP
- Promptly notify customers when leaks appear within the customers' control





Updated Emergency Regulations - Enforcement

- SWRCB and retail water agency enforcement provisions:
 - SWRCB
 - Information Order information request
 - Conservation Order action plan
 - Cease and Desist Order
 - may fine an agency up to \$10,000 per day for noncompliance
 - Retail water
 - To be defined by each retail water provider





Updated Emergency Regulations

- Additional Enforcement Legislation Pending
 - To place cities and water districts on equal enforcement footing
- **OC Water Agencies Working Together**
 - Outreach, Messaging and Enforcement
- 9 Tiers of Conservation Goals
 - **8% to 36% Reduction by Utility**
 - **Statewide Average = 25%**



Compliance Timeline

Emergency Regulations approved by the SWRCB on May 5, 2015

- Estimated approval by Office of Administrative Law no later than May 19, 2015
- Retail agencies to begin compliance no later than May 19, 2015 (estimated)





Rebates & Incentives

Give your plants the right amount of water — no more, no less.



SOIL MOISTURE SENSOR CONTROLLERS take the guesswork out of watering by monitoring your soil moisture and telling your sprinkler system how long to water your plants. This device can reduce outdoor water waste by up to 70% while keeping your plants healthy and attractive.

Rebate level: Up to \$380 per controller for properties

1 acre, or \$25 per station for properties >1 acre.

RAIN BARRELS capture the rainwater that falls onto your also reduce ocean water pollution by preventing rainwater from carrying fertilizers, pet waste, and harmful debris from your poperty out into the ocean.

Rebate level: \$75 per barrel (50-gallons or larger)

Landscape Irrigation Survey

For Commercial, Industrial, Institutional and Common Area Landscapes



A certified landscape irrigation auditor will survey and provide written recommendations for qualifying non-residential properties within Metropolitan's 5,200 square-mile service area at no cost. To participate, properties must have a minimum of one acre of irrigated land. Eligible landscapes include commercial and industrial sites, homeowner association common areas, and institutional situs like schools, parks and government facilities.

Surveys are scheduled on a first-come, first-served basis. To request a survey, please complete the online application at bewaterwise.com®. Funding is limited and submitting an application does not guarantee a survey will be provided.

WHAT TO EXPECT

The property owner, manager or authorized representative with access to the irrigation controllers must be present during the survey. The certified landscape irrigation auditor will conduct a comprehensive review of the irrigation system including:

- System pressure
- Controllers
- Site conditions and irrigation scheduling
- Issues that cause higher water use, such as valve malfunctions, high or low pressure, sprinkler misalignment, poor drainage, breaks and loaks, runoff, etc.

Participants will receive a written report that includes:

- Data collected during the survey
- Recommendations for improving the site's irrigation officiency including system repairs, equipment updates, and irrigation scheduling
- Information about available financial incentives to help with the cost of recommended improvements

- Free Landscape Survey for sites 1+ acres
- Performed by landscape technician
- Includes detailed report with water saving recommendations and grant opportunities

Rebates Available to Public Agencies

Eligible Devices	Public Agency Incentive
Turf Removal (Rebate not paid up-front) 250 square foot minimum	Incentive Level currently being revised
Weather-Based or Central Computer * Irrigation Controller	\$55 per station
Soil Moisture Sensor Systems * Connected to irrigation controller	\$55 per station
Large Rotary Nozzles * Minimum 8 sets of two (2) per application	\$13 per set
Rotating Nozzles for Pop-Up Spray Heads * Minimum 15 per application	\$6 each

<u>Note</u>: Rebates for these devices "*" <u>are paid</u> to public agencies upfront to allow for purchase of devices with rebate incentives.

High-Efficiency Toilets (Flushometer)	\$100
Ultra Low and Zero Water Urinals	\$200
Plumbing Flow Control Valves	\$5/Valve (minimum of 20)
	Food Equipment
Connectionless Food Steamers	\$485/Compartment
Air-cooled Ice Machines	\$1000
	HVAC Equipment
Cooling Tower Conductivity Controllers	\$625
Cooling Tower ph Controllers	\$1,750
