Preparing for Transition Meetings

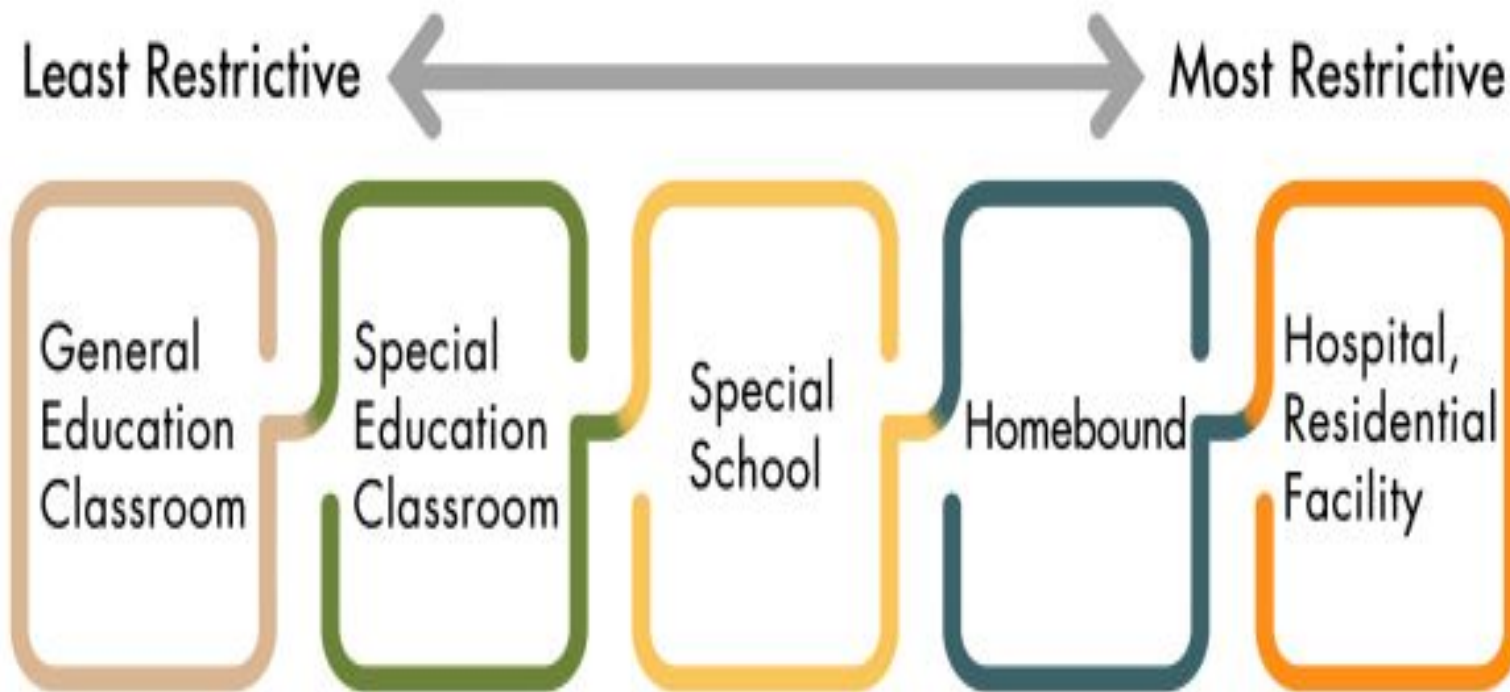
- **When do Districts start collaborating?**
 - Late January/February
- **What is the first step?**
 - FJUHSD School Leads - Psychologists complete student observations and review of student records;
 - During the observations, Districts are discussing current needs and progress; and providing the sending team with information on the high school's current programs.

Preparing for Transition Meetings

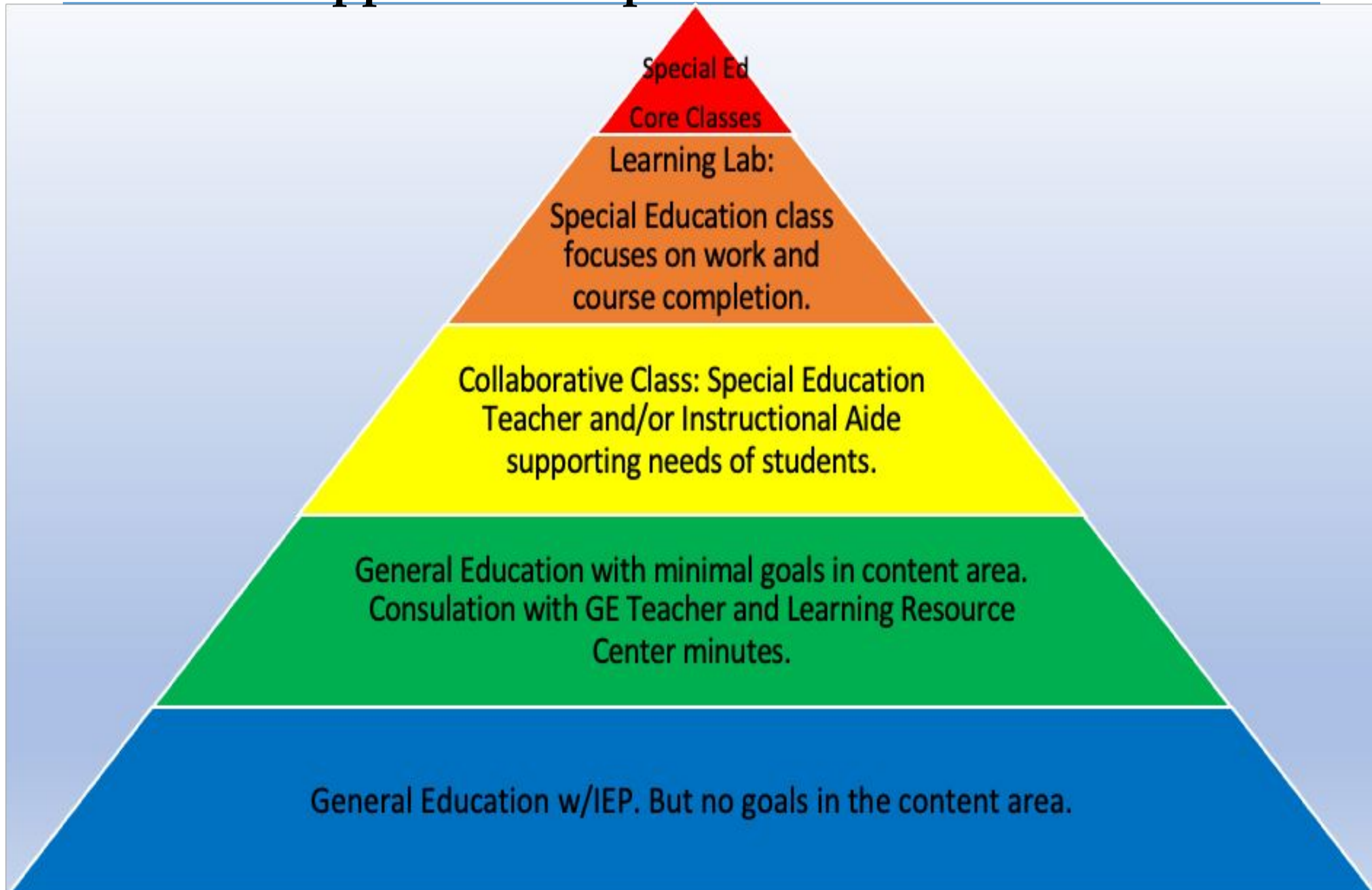
- **When are IEP meetings conducted?**
 - March/April/May
 - Districts will block out 2-4 weeks to complete all IEP meetings.
- **When are the IEP documents transferred from the elementary Districts to FJUHSD?**
 - Consented to IEPs will be sent via email after the meeting concludes;
 - District clerk's will mail student's file in July to FJUHSD.

FAPE in the Least Restrictive Environment (“LRE”)

Because LRE is determined by the student’s individualized program of instruction and related services rather than by setting, IDEA requires that school districts create a continuum of alternative placement options. This continuum represents a range of educational placements in which an IEP can be implemented to meet the individual needs of students with disabilities. These placement options range from the least restrictive setting (i.e., general education classroom) to the most restrictive ones (e.g., residential facility).

FAPE DETERMINES LOCATION

Open Enrollment- FJUHSD

- ❖ January 17, through February 3, 2023 at 3:00 pm,
- ❖ Considers parent choice,
- ❖ Considers space based on class sizes, and
- ❖ District and Site consider if FAPE can or cannot be provided at school of choice.

IEP Team offers FAPE

- ❖ Considers student's disabilities,
- ❖ Considers student's unique educational needs,
- ❖ Considers extent of special education and related services for ensuring educational progress and benefit,
- ❖ Considers location of specialized programs, and
- ❖ IEP team meeting determines FAPE for all transition stages.

- Entitles services until academic year of age 22;

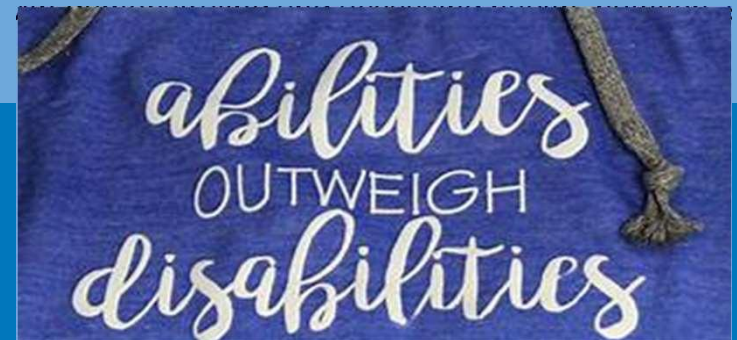

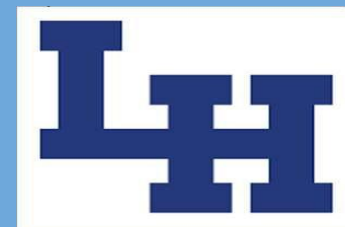
