Maureen DiMarco Award **Presented to Rudy Hanley**

On May 7, 2014, the Orange County School Boards Association (OCSBA) presented the Maureen DiMarco Award to Rudy Hanley, President and CEO of SchoolsFirst Federal Credit Union, in recognition of his visionary leadership and his steadfast commitment to public education in Orange County.

SchoolsFirst has served the education community for almost 80 years, and under Rudy's leadership, has become the largest educational credit union in the country, serving a half-million members. During his tenure at SchoolsFirst, Rudy established the non-profit Education Foundation for Orange County Schools to

generate grant funding for teachers to develop innovative programs and activities for students. Since its inception, the Foundation has raised more than \$285,000 for schools. In addition, SchoolsFirst provides financial support and exceptional gifts for the Orange County Classified School Employees of the Year and the Orange County Teachers of the Year celebrations, as well as support for numerous other conferences, meetings, events, and competitions throughout the county.

Rudy's unwavering focus on corporate social responsibility has earned SchoolsFirst recognition for wide-ranging philanthropic endeavors, many centered on education and the needs of young people. SchoolsFirst employees volunteer on behalf of Orange County students by assisting with programs such as Orange County Academic Pentathlon, Read Across America, Principal for a Day, and Job Shadowing at various branches. Through the Worthy Student Award Scholarship Program, Credit Union team members personally present more than \$180,000 in scholarships each year to high schools.

Designed to recognize exemplary and far-reaching leadership in addressing the broad needs of young people, the Maureen DiMarco award, first presented in 1993, recognizes the contributions of Maureen DiMarco, who served as California's first Cabinet Secretary for Child Development and Education, President of California School Boards Association, and President of Orange County School Boards Association.

58 Orange County Schools Named State's Best

Fifty-eight Orange County elementary schools have been named California Distinguished Schools – the top honor for schools in the state and the most ever named in the county during a single year.

The Orange County campuses are among 424 elementary schools named as California Distinguished Schools by state Superintendent of Public Instruction Tom Torlakson.

The 2014 California Distinguished Schools Program focuses on California's students' right to an equitable and rigorous education, and recognizes those schools that have made progress in narrowing the academic achievement gap. Elementary and secondary schools are recognized in alternative years.

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Dr. Gregory Franklin Named ACSA 2014 California Superintendent of the Year

Tustin Unified School District Superintendent Dr. Gregory Franklin has been named 2014 California Superintendent of the Year by the Association of California School Administrators (ACSA).

"There are over 1,000 superintendents in California representing 19 regions and to be chosen as state Superintendent of the Year is quite an accomplishment," said San Diego County's Valley Center-Pauma Unified School District Superintendent Dr. Lou Obermeyer, who made the announcement. "All superintendents are very proud of Greg and his achievements and dedication to public education."

ACSA was established in 1971, and is the largest umbrella organization for school leaders in the nation, serving more than 16,000 school leaders throughout California. The organization annually honors outstanding administrators for their leadership skills, professionalism, creativity, innovation, and commitment to a quality education.

In February, Dr. Franklin was selected as Orange County Superintendent of the Year by ACSA, Region 17, which represents 28 school districts in Orange County. His nomination was submitted and reviewed at the state level by a committee of school administrators and ACSA staff members. Dr. Franklin will be recognized at the organization's annual Leadership Summit on November 6-8 in San Diego.

MICHAEL MATSUDA – Anaheim Union High School District

The Board of Trustees of the Anaheim Union High School District approved the appointment of Mr. Michael Matsuda as superintendent, effective March 17.

Mr. Matsuda knows the Anaheim Union High School District well. His 21 years as an educator in the district include teaching at Orangeview Junior High School and Oxford Academy, and as a district administrator overseeing professional development for teachers and administrators. Mr. Matsuda, who has a bachelor's degree in English from UCLA and a master's degree in public administration from USC, was twice named teacher of the year while at Orangeview.

He currently serves as co-chair of P21 California, a statewide coalition of organizations supporting 21st Century skills and content for public education. Mr. Matsuda, a Yorba Linda resident, is also an elected trustee for the North Orange County Community College District. He has served as a trustee since 2005.
