Al Mijares, Ph.D. Orange County Superintendent of Schools

Introducing Our New Orange County Superintendent of Schools, Al Mijares, Ph.D.

Dr. Al Mijares has been a dedicated educator for 34 years, and he is excited to begin working with teachers, support staff, administrators, superintendents, school board members, and community partners to ensure that Orange County districts remain the strongest in the state. A native of California, born in Pasadena, Dr. Mijares graduated from Simi Valley High School in 1971, and he received a scholarship to California State University, Northridge, where he earned his Bachelor's degree in Child Development/Special Education. He earned his Master's degree in Social Welfare from the University of California, Berkeley, and his doctorate from the University of Southern California.

Al's distinguished career includes several years of successful teaching experience in K-12 classrooms as well as serving as a principal in the Moreno Valley Unified School District and as Superintendent of the Bakersfield City School District and Coachella Valley Unified School District. He has held faculty positions as an adjunct professor at Chapman University and taught part-time at both Pepperdine University and Compton College.

Since August 2006, Dr. Mijares served for the College Board as Vice President of the Western Region. Before that, he served as Superintendent of the Santa Ana Unified School District for more than eleven years.

Al and his wife of 39 years, Jackie, are the proud parents of five grown sons, all educated in the Orange County public school system.

Dr. Mijares looks forward to supporting the work of school board members throughout the county in working together to ensure a world-class education where every student succeeds.



254 Orange County Students Named National Merit Semifinalists

Two hundred fifty-four Orange County high school students who aced their Preliminary SAT exams have been named National Merit semifinalists, an elite designation awarded to just one percent of test-takers nationwide.

The honorees, who will have the opportunity to compete for finalist status and college scholarships, were announced by the Evanston, Illinois based National Merit Scholarship Corporation. In California, semifinalists were required to score a minimum of 220 out of 240 on their PSAT as juniors.

The semifinalists will be invited to apply to become finalists by submitting a personal essay, high school grades, a school recommendation, and their SAT score to confirm PSAT performance. Finalists become eligible to compete for the prestigious National Merit Scholar designation and scholarship money.

ROBERT PLETKA, Ed.D. – Fullerton School District
